- Not user-friendly
- Weird: need to amend previous commit
- ...

2. Changing the ref to refs/for/master instead of refs/heads/master

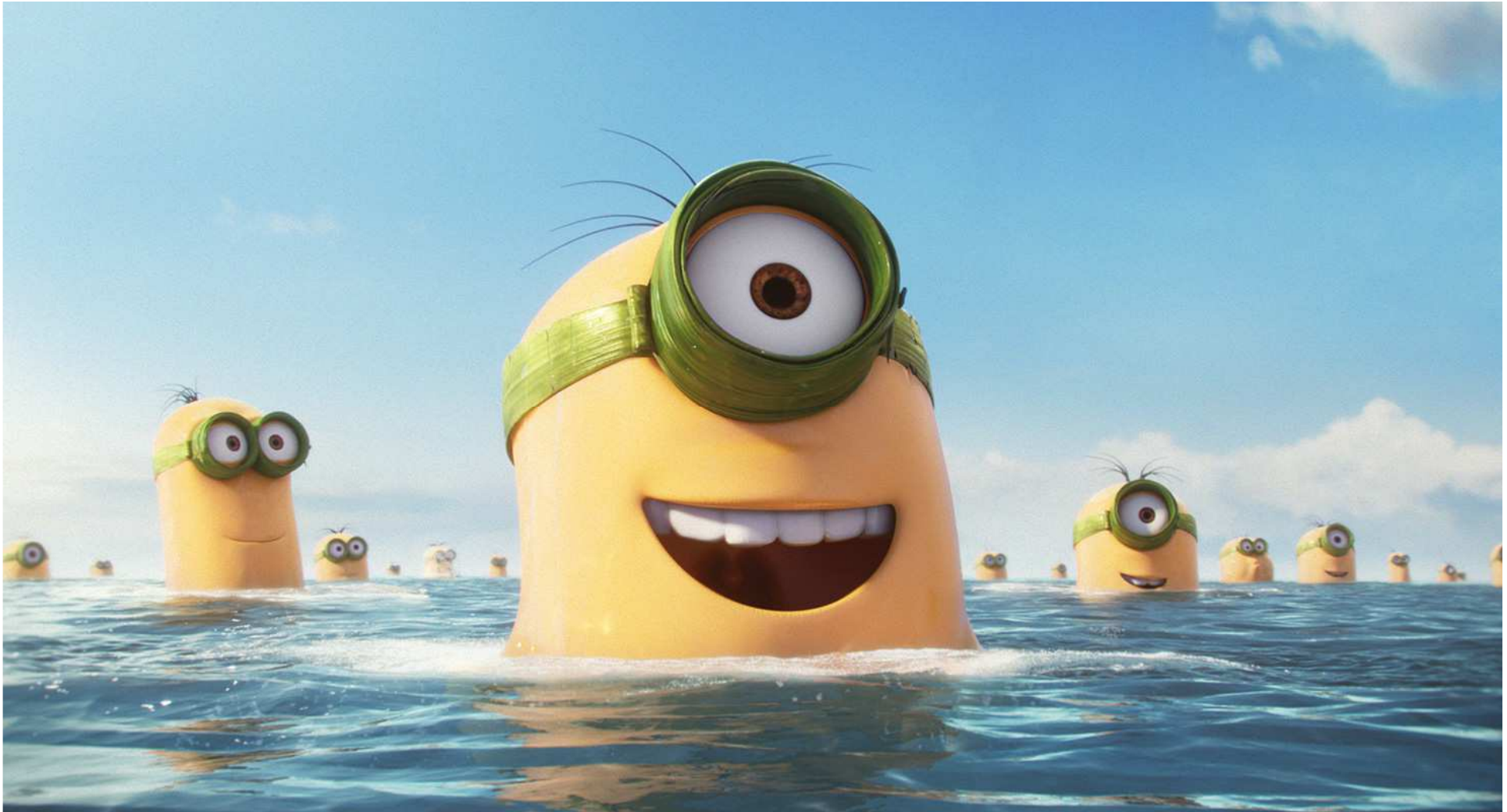
